Here are our expectations of Club members:

1. Service. As an organization whose motto is "Service Above Self," participation in service projects is fundamentally important. It is an expectation of membership that you will participate in one or more of the avenues of service: club, community, international, vocational, and youth.

2. Engagement. Rotary was founded on fellowship so attendance at our regular gatherings, including meetings, fund-raisers, social activities, and, as stated, service projects are basic. And we expect our members to join at least one committee.

3. Leadership. Rotary is made up of leaders. You can expect at some point to be asked to take on a leadership role in some project, committee, or the Club itself. Our expectation is that you will see this as an opportunity rather than a burden, and, all things being equal, will accept this leadership role.

4. Philanthropy. Rotarians are generous not only with their time, but with their resources as well. During the course of the year, you will hear requests for financial support for projects, and The Rotary Foundation. Our expectation is that your will contribute commensurate with your circumstances. But rest assured, there will never be any undue pressure placed upon you or any member of the Club for such a contribution.

5. Vision. We seek input from all members and value all points-of-view. It is our expectation that you will contribute your thoughts and ideas to the Club's Rotary experience.
